AMERICAN SOLDIERS APPLYING IN VAIN FOR PERMISSION TO MARRY GERMAN GIRLS

Berlin (ANS) American soldiers in growing numbers are applying in vain for Army permission to marry German girls. Both officers and enlisted men are among those who have filed written requests, but a Welfare Department official said, "It probably will be a year yet before such weddings will be permitted."

Policy advisers of General Eisenhower's staff, however, are already studying the question of what to do about children born of forbidden romances.

Thus far only international marriage has been authorized here, and this was a wedding of a GI and a Lithuanian girl in a displaced persons camp 300 miles from Berlin.
